Located in the heart of the dynamic Northern Virginia region, our post-high school program addresses a growing critical gap in higher education through a model that cultivates intellectual rigor, personal agency, and whole-person, purposeful living.

Founded by David and Robin Fouse, established business and community leaders with deep experience in developing young people, Spire Halls prepares students for more than knowledge work that often fails to engage purpose and meaning. Our approach emphasizes whole-person learning that prepares young people not just to think critically (mind), but to understand how their faith (soul) and physical life (body) are inextricably connected in that person they hope to become.

Spire Halls' college courses are fully accredited through our university partnership with Southeastern University. We focus on the technical and highly practical skills of communication and entrepreneurship that students need in today's fast-evolving world, regardless of career direction. All courses are taught in a tutorial-style learning environment that encourages critical thinking, dynamic dialogue, and practical application—an educational approach as old as civilization yet perfectly suited for developing the adaptable, thoughtful leaders needed in our technological age.

THE EDUCATIONAL LANDSCAPE

The Global Context: Disruption and Work

The world is undergoing a profound transformation at an unprecedented pace. While technological disruptions from artificial intelligence to automation may seem uniquely modern, they represent the latest chapter in humanity's ongoing adaptation to new tools and possibilities. Just as the transition from horse-drawn carriages to automobiles fundamentally reshaped society and the economy, today's technological shifts demand education that develops not just specific skills, but the capacity to adapt, create, and lead through change. The accelerating impact of emerging technologies on the global workforce intensifies the urgency of our mission.

By the Numbers: The Current State of Education and Work

Higher Education Challenges: • Undergraduate enrollment has declined approximately 8.5% since 2010 (National Center for Education Statistics) • The percentage of high school graduates immediately enrolling in college has fallen from 70% in 2016 to 62% in 2022 (Education Data) • Student loan debt has reached \$1.75 trillion, leading many families to question the traditional model (Federal Reserve) • Only 62% of students who begin college complete their degree within six years (National Student Clearinghouse)

The Skills Gap: • Only 34% of current students believe they will graduate with the skills needed for job market success (Strada Education Network) • 55% of employers report that recent graduates lack necessary interpersonal and communication skills (Society for Human Resource Management) • 53% of employers say college graduates lack problem-solving skills (PayScale) • Al spending will grow to over \$550 billion in 2024, with an expected Al talent gap of 50% (Reuters)

College Enrollment Patterns: • The greatest number of college students are enrolled at public four-year universities (7.9 million), followed by public two-year colleges (4.8 million) (BestColleges) • Among recent high school graduates enrolled in college, 3 out of 4 attend 4-year colleges (Bureau of Labor Statistics) • Female students are 86.4% more likely to attend 4-year institutions compared to males (Education Data) • Undergraduate enrollment in bachelor's degree programs increased by 2.9% in fall 2024, though these numbers still remain below 2019 levels (National Student Clearinghouse Research Center)

The Whole Person Development Gap:

- Faith and Religious Practice Decline: From 1986 to 2016, the percentage of college students with no religious affiliation tripled, going from 10% to 31%, while those attending religious services dropped from 85% to 69% (Deseret News) Studies show two-thirds (66%) of teenagers who regularly attend church drop out for at least a year between the ages of 18 and 22, with 47% of those who attended college citing the move to college as a contributing factor (Lifeway Research)
- Physical Activity Decline: College years show a significant decline in physical activity, with research demonstrating that "the transition from high school to college years" results in a drop from 65% to 38% of students engaging in regular vigorous physical activity (PMC)

Critical Market Gaps:

- The Traditional College Alternative Gap Need for focused, career-relevant education
- The Skills-Workplace Readiness Gap Employers seek graduates with practical capabilities
- The Faith/Physical/Academic Integration Gap Few programs holistically developing mind, body, and soul. Options are even more limited in the two-year accredited program space.

THE SPIRE HALLS APPROACH

Distinctive Educational Model

Spire Halls delivers college-accredited courses through a tutorial-style learning environment that encourages critical thinking and dynamic dialogue. All courses are accredited by Southeastern University (SEU) under their regional accreditation, ensuring academic credibility and transferability.

Core Methodological Elements:

- Question-driven learning over passive consumption of information
- Development of students' ability to articulate and defend ideas clearly
- Collaborative discovery through rigorous discussion
- Direct connection of academic concepts to practical application and ethical considerations

Students begin their Spire Halls journey with a foundational prerequisite course exploring our integrated mind, body, and soul philosophy. This course establishes the theoretical and practical framework for how disciplined physical development, intellectual rigor, and soul formation work together to develop whole-person excellence and purpose-driven living.

While participation in Spire Running is the preferred pathway that most fully integrates with our educational philosophy, students may also fulfill this requirement through approved alternative physical development programs that align with our holistic approach. All students, regardless of their chosen physical program, will participate in regular integration sessions connecting physical development principles to academic and soul formation.

The lessons of disciplined physical activity—goal-setting, perseverance, teamwork, and resilience—are integrated throughout our curriculum, not as a separate program but as complementary aspects of comprehensive human development.

Learning Environment

The Spire Halls learning environment is designed to foster collaboration, presentation skills, and professional development:

- Open-concept classroom spaces with flexible configurations
- Glass-enclosed meeting rooms for small group discussions and project work
- Professional presentation stage for developing public speaking confidence
